

Volunteer Projects (As of October 2015)



Big Projects (material/funding and labor):

- Remodel Cabins: Sheet rocking, painting, carpeting
- Finish Remodeling Cabins 13 & 14
- Put in new carpets in cabins
- Replace Screens specifically at Cabin 8 & Efficiency.
- Start Replacing Dock
- Replace flooring, upgrade cabinets & more updates in Efficiency Cabin
- Remodel Cabinets in McKnight & Efficiency Cabin
- Build staircases/ramps to make buildings accessible, especially those that have eroded. (Boyd Hall Rear Entrance)
- Build benches for bathhouses
- Build a camp store in cabin 4.
- Put new roof on Lake Bathhouse
- Clean up roofs & spray for moss
- Fill Pot Holes in Road or Pave
- Clear trees around lake at Vesper Dell
- Cut trees around Cabin 15 for more light to keep away dampness.
- Replace old fencing with new fencing near barn area

Painting Needs

- Paint exterior on buildings that are faded and need repair
- Paint the exterior of the house & office
- Paint fencing around Lake Bathhouse

- Repaint Pews

Projects with low cost:

- Take down fireplace in Picnic Shelter
- Take Down Gris Mill/ Take metal off of Grist Mill
- Clean up grounds in Unit A & make clear paths
- Clearing unit C of down limbs and brush
- Clear High and Low Ropes Course area and path of debris
- Remove brush pile on the dam
- Clean-up Garden
- Take down speakers in Boyd Hall
- Power wash roofs of buildings /spray to prevent moss
- Muck and repair horse stalls, replant grass

Seasonal

- Rake, blow and burn Leaves
- Cleaning up down limbs & clean out gutters.
- Rake Up Volleyball Court
- Landscape around Hafer, Boyd & McKnight & Shannon's Hill
- Spray for Poison Ivy & Oak in areas for camping
