

## Week at a Glance: Turn Around

Day	Title	Daily Bible Text and Verse	Focus Point
1	Hope and Joy	Luke 24: 13-35 Two travelers walk with a stranger on the road to Emmaus	Even though they don't recognize Him, Jesus comes alongside them. God is present even when we don't realize it. When the disciples invite Jesus to stay, their relationship deepens. Encountering Jesus often begins with invitation.
2	Follow Jesus	Acts 9:1-19 God changes Saul to Paul	Saul's encounter with Jesus stops him in his tracks. Following Jesus means letting Him interrupt our plans. Saul must trust Jesus even while blind, and Ananias must obey despite fear. Following Jesus often means taking faithful steps before we can see the full picture.
3	Wholeness and thanksgiving	Luke 17:11-19 Jesus heals the ten men but only one comes back to thank him	All ten are healed, but only one acknowledges where it came from. The healed man doesn't just feel grateful—he turns back, praises God, and falls at Jesus' feet. True thanksgiving moves us to respond intentionally, thanksgiving starts when we recognize what God has done in our lives.
4	Reconciliation	Genesis 32-33 Esau forgives Jacob	Jacob faces his fear, admits his past wrongs, and humbles himself before God and Esau. Reconciliation starts when we are willing to own our mistakes and approach others with humility. Esau's embrace shows the healing power of forgiveness.
5	Tell the good news	John 4:1-26 The woman at the well	Jesus crosses cultural, social, and religious barriers to meet the Samaritan woman. The Good News is not limited by background, past mistakes, or status—Jesus meets people where they are. The Good News tells us that Jesus meets our deepest needs and offers lasting hope and restoration.
6	Be a neighbor	Luke 10:25-37 The good Samaritan	The Samaritan sees the injured man and is moved to act, while others pass by. Being a neighbor begins when we allow compassion to interrupt our routines. We are called to love and care for others, even when it is uncomfortable or costly.
